GRADUATE PROGRAM  
MASTER'S/DOCTORATE  
(2019 admissions)**

Admissions for the Master's and Doctorate degrees of the Graduate Program in Political Science at USP will be open from **August 6<sup>th</sup> to August 10<sup>th</sup> 2018**. The classes are to begin in the first semester of 2019. In addition to the general requirements of the Faculdade de Filosofia, Letras e Ciências Humanas, PPG-Political Science has its own specific demands in this call, approved by the Coordinating Committee.

## **1. Application**

In order to apply for the Graduate Program in Political Science, it is mandatory for the Master's candidate to have an undergraduate certificate and for the PhD candidate to hold a Master's degree.

Current Master's students who wish to continue in the Graduate Program to obtain a PhD degree will participate in a new selection process, complying with the regulatory requirements.

2. Undergraduate Diploma (front and back on the same sheet) or, if it is not available, undergraduate certificate with graduation date (front and back on the same sheet);

3. Undergraduate transcript, including graduation date, for Master's candidates and Master's transcript for PhD candidates;
4. Master's Diploma (only for Brazilian PhD applicants who did not graduate at USP). It is mandatory to include on the back of the document the accreditation ordinance (Portaria de Credenciamento) from CAPES<sup>1</sup>;
5. If the applicant has not concluded the Master degree yet, a letter of intent (Termos de Compromisso) from graduation or Master's defense, is available at <http://pos.fflch.usp.br/node/317>
6. Master's candidates *are allowed* to provide an electronic copy (PDF format) of an undergraduate assignment of their own or any other paper of their own if they wish. PhD candidates *are allowed* to provide an electronic copy (PDF format) of their Master's Dissertation.
7. *Curriculum Vitae* (CNPq format – Lattes). It is mandatory to register a CV in the Lattes platform; other formats will not be accepted. It is optional to include or highlight information in one (1) extra page attached to the Lattes CV ([lattes.cnpq.br](http://lattes.cnpq.br))
8. Identity card and CPF (for Brazilians)
9. RNE or Passport (for foreigners). Passports will be accepted only for the application process. The admitted candidates will only be enrolled upon presenting an RNE (Registo Nacional de Estrangeiros) or 'protocolo' of the RNE.
10. Receipt of payment for the application fee of R\$ 80.00 (eighty Reais). The bank slip for payment can be will be available from **August 6<sup>th</sup> to August 10<sup>th</sup>, 2018**. Questions or problems issuing the bank slip, please call (11) 3091-4623 or 3091-4626. Foreign candidates should inquire by email ([ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br)), about how to proceed to make the payment. Additional information regarding the payment of the application fee can be obtained from the Secretaria de pós-graduação da FFLCH ([posfflch@usp.br](mailto:posfflch@usp.br))
11. Proof of residence, if the prospective student lives in another state or abroad and wants to request a remote/virtual interview.
12. A Research Proposal (in Portuguese, English or Spanish) for the Master's candidates or a Dissertation Project (in Portuguese, English or Spanish) for the Doctorate candidates have to be sent by **October 12 2018, 11:59pm** (Brasília time) to the email: [ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br). Files sent after this deadline will not be considered and the candidate will be automatically disqualified.
13. The selected candidates from the first phase should choose up to two advisers among the accredited faculty in the Program (check the certified program

advisers in the annex of this call). This selection is not binding nor does it constitute a prerequisite for admission. The candidate may be invited to alter their choice in the event of lack of availability with the chosen adviser or research line.

#### OBSERVATIONS:

1. **For candidates who are not completing their Master's at USP:** It will not be possible to enroll in the PhD program without presenting the Master's Diploma, or, in its absence, click [here](#) to print an example of the statement to be issued by the candidate's university (all information should be provided).
2. **For Master's candidates from USP,** after the defense, the Master's degree is automatically generated by the Sistema Janus, and then they will be able to apply and register in the PhD program.
3. For candidates with a **Master's Diploma from a university abroad,** the deadline to obtain the Title Equivalence approval from USP is the last day of enrollment. Thus, the submission for Title Equivalence of the Master's Degree must be requested before applying in this selection process.

The absence of any document or the failure to comply with deadlines and requirements will result in the dismissal of the application.

A list of approved applications will be announced by **August 17<sup>th</sup> 2018**.

Appeals against the registrations must be sent by filling the form ([appealing\\_form](#)) within 48 hours by email to the postgraduate secretariat ([ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br)) and will be answered in the shortest possible time by the coordinators of the program.

## 2. Selection

The Program Coordinating Committee will designate admissions committees that will be responsible for the following aspects of the selection process:

- a-. The written exam of proficiency in a foreign language, or in Portuguese in the case of foreign candidates;
- b. The (written) substantive exam
- c. The Research Proposal or Dissertation Project and the interview by the Examining Committee;
- d. Analysis of the CV.

Admittance in the first two evaluations is a prerequisite to continue in the selection process.

## 2.1 Master's Program

The selection process for the Master's Program will be comprised of the following evaluations:

**A – Language proficiency test – September 4<sup>th</sup> 2018 at 2.00pm** – in a room yet to be designated at the Philosophy and Social Sciences Building.

In accordance with the rules of the Graduate Program in Political Science, proficiency in English must be verified before the student's admission in the Master's and PhD programs. The candidate should demonstrate ability to read and comprehend texts in English. The candidate must complete the exam within three hours, **without consulting any sort of material**. Candidates will be identified only by code, generated for the coordinators of the program for this sole purpose.

During the exam, the candidate will not be permitted to use electronic devices of any type, or any device that is capable of communicating outside of the exam classroom. Any devices should be switched off and deposited with the organizers, under penalty of disqualification and elimination from the selection process.

The proof of English proficiency can also be made during the application process by annexing an official TOEFL certificate (at least 213 points for the Computer-based test – CBT; 550 points for the Paper-based test, or 80 points for the Internet-based test – IBT), or IELTS certificate (minimum mark: 6). The certificates should have been taken within the last 5 years.

Foreign candidates should demonstrate Portuguese proficiency in a specific exam conducted by a committee. The objective and procedures are similar to the English proficiency exam. If English is not their native tongue, the student must also demonstrate English proficiency.

The foreign candidate who was approved at CELPE-BRAS, advanced level, or who attended an undergraduate or graduate course in a Brazilian university, or who comes from a Portuguese-speaking country will be exempted from demonstrating Portuguese proficiency. Candidates should present an official certificate that shows their scores, valid for 5 years from the issuing date, or other document proving the above mentioned circumstances.

Candidates who have been approved in the English proficiency test from the Political Science graduate program in the past 4 years do not have to take a new exam.

Language proficiency test results will be announced on or before **September 26<sup>th</sup>, 2018**.

Appeals against the registrations must be sent by filling the form ([appealing\\_form](#)) within 48 hours by email to the postgraduate secretariat ([ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br)) and will be answered in the shortest possible time by the coordinators of the program.

**B – Written Exams – September 4<sup>th</sup>, 2018, at 2.00pm** – in a room yet to be designated at the Philosophy and Social Sciences Building.

The written exam is mandatory to all Master's candidates. The questions cover the following fields: **1) Political Theory and Political Thought, 2) Brazilian Politics and Comparative Politics, 3) Public Policy and 4) International Relations.** Each candidate must respond to two questions from different fields. The questions are presented in Portuguese and the answers can be given in Portuguese, English or Spanish.

The candidate must complete the exam within four hours, **without consulting any sort of material**. Candidates will be identified only by a code, which will be generated by the program coordinators for this purpose only.

During the exam, the candidate will not be permitted to use electronic devices of any type, or any device that is capable of communicating outside of the exam classroom. Any devices should be switched off and deposited with the organizers, under penalty of disqualification and elimination from the selection process.

The student will receive a score from 0 (zero) to 10.0 (ten) in the written exam. The exam is eliminatory and the minimum passing score required to carry on to subsequent phases is **6.0 (six) for the Master's program**.

The written exam results will be announced on or before **September 26<sup>th</sup>, 2018**.

Appeals regarding the written exam results must be sent by filling the form ([appealing\\_form](#)) within 48 hours by email to the postgraduate secretariat ([ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br)) and will be answered in the shortest possible time by the coordinators of the program.

## **C – Evaluation of CV**

Successful candidates in the written and language proficiency exams will have their Lattes CV evaluated, and will be given a score according to their previous school transcripts, academic activities and research conducted. This evaluation is carried out to assess their potential to meet the demands of the Graduate Program.

To evaluate the candidate's CV we will take into consideration: a) school transcripts and additional assignments; b) participation in research projects or conduct of undergraduate scientific projects, with information about the sponsoring institution; c) presentations in conferences, and publications in proceedings or publication in academic journals.

The admissions committee will evaluate the CVs between **October 15<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>**.

The results of the CV evaluation will be announced by **October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2018**.

Appeals regarding the CV evaluation results must be sent within 48 hours by email to the postgraduate secretariat and will be answered in the shortest possible time by the coordinators of the program.

## **D – Research Project and Interview**

Candidates for the Master's program should submit their Research Project (of 15 pages at most – not including references – double spaced and in Times New Roman font size 12) in Portuguese, English or Spanish, in line with the following structure of contents, under penalty of being disqualified:

- (i) Research subject in Political Science;
- (ii) Justification of relevance; and
- (iii) Evaluation of the bibliographical references relevant to the subject.

The proposal should be sent by email (PDF format) to [ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br) by **October 12<sup>th</sup> 2018** before 11:59pm (Brasília time). The selected candidates who passed the language proficiency test (item A) and the written exam (item B) will have their Lattes CV and Undergraduate records evaluated (item C), and will participate in the interviews (item D). The interviews will be conducted between **November 5<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> 2018**, at a location to be confirmed.

Foreign candidates or residents from other Brazilian states can request, when applying, a remote/virtual interview (item D). In order to do this, they should present a proof of residence (document 10 on item 1) while applying. The Program Coordinators will seek a way to conduct the remote/virtual interview with those candidates approved in phases A and B, ensuring equivalent conditions among all candidates. In the event it is impossible to ensure such conditions and conduct the remote/virtual interview, the Program Coordinators will formally inform the candidate that they should take the exam in person at USP. Hence, the application for a remote/virtual interview does not generate a guaranteed right to this option.

The results of the Research Project and Interview will be announced by **November 9<sup>th</sup> 2018**.

Appeals regarding the Research Project and Interview results must be sent by filling the form ([\(appealing\\_form\)](#)) within 48 hours by email to the postgraduate secretariat ([ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br)) and will be answered in the shortest possible time by the coordinators of the program.

## **E - Selection of admitted candidates**

The selection of admitted candidates will be a result of: a) the criteria of minimum passing scores in phases A and B; b) the classification score that consists of the average across items B, C and D, weighted in the proportion 2:1:2; c) the disqualification of candidates with an average score of less than 6.0 and d) consideration of the limited number of positions available in the Political Science Program.

The preliminary selection results and the ranking of the approved, pending only the decision on possible appeals for the interview, will be released on **November 9<sup>th</sup> 2018**.

The final selection results and the ranking of the approved will be released on or before the **16<sup>th</sup> November 2018**.

## **2.2 - PhD Program**

### **A –Language proficiency test**

The language proficiency test to enter the PhD program will be the same as indicated in item “2.1.A.” described above, including all certificates that are accepted and the exemptions stipulated in that item (2.1A).

### **B – Written Exam**

The written exam to enter the PhD Program is the same as indicated in item “2.1B” above, but the minimum passing score for admission is **7.0 (seven)**. Candidates previously admitted in the Master’s program of this department are exempted from taking a new written exam, provided they took the exam in the last four years, and their score was 7.0 (seven) or more. Only students who meet these requirements can take a new exam if they wish to improve their score. In this case, the new score will prevail even if it is lower than the previous one, which means they could be at risk of being disqualified.

The exam scores will be released by the **26<sup>th</sup> September 2018**.

Appeals regarding the Written Exam results must be sent by filling the form ([appealing\\_form](#)) within 48 hours by email to the postgraduate secretariat ([ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br)) and will be answered in the shortest possible time by the coordinators of the program.

### **C – CV and Master's Transcript Evaluation**

The successful candidates in the written and language proficiency exams will have their Lattes CV and Master's transcript evaluated, and will be given a score according

to their previous school transcripts, academic activities and research conducted. This evaluation is carried out to assess their potential to meet the demands of the Graduate Program.

To evaluate the candidate's CV we will take into consideration: a) Evaluation of Master's transcripts; b) participation in research projects or the conduct of undergraduate scientific projects, with information about sponsoring institution; c) professional background or internships connected to education or the practical application of knowledge; d) presentations in conferences, and its publication in proceedings; e) publication in academic journals, book chapters and books; f) the Master's dissertation.

The admissions committee will evaluate the CVs between **October 15<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>**.

The CV evaluation result will be announced **up to October 19<sup>th</sup> 2018**.

Appeals regarding the CV Evaluation results must be sent by filling the form ([appealing\\_form](#)) within 48 hours by email to the postgraduate secretariat ([ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br)) and will be answered in the shortest possible time by the coordinators of the program.

## **D – Research Project and Interview**

The candidates for the PhD program should submit a Research Project (of at most 20 pages– not including bibliographical references – double spaced and in Times New Roman font size 12) in Portuguese, English or Spanish, in line with the following structure of content, under penalty of being disqualified:

- (i) Presentation of theme and justification of its relevance to Political Science;
- (ii) Evaluation of the relevant bibliographical references;
- (iii) Presentation of objectives and the main research hypotheses;
- (iv) When relevant, presentation of research design and methodological procedures that will be adopted.

This proposal should be sent by email (PDF format) to [ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br) by October 12<sup>th</sup> 2018 before 11:59pm (Brasília time). The selected candidates who passed the language test (item A) and the written exam (item B), will participate in the interviews (item C) and will have their Lattes and Master's transcript evaluated (item D). The interviews of the candidates will be conducted between **05<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> November 2018**, at a location to be confirmed.

Foreign candidates or residents of other Brazilian states can request, when applying, a remote/virtual interview (item D). In order to do this, they should present a proof of residence (document 11 on item 1) while applying. The Program Coordinators will

seek a way to conduct the remote/virtual interview with those candidates approved in phases A and B, ensuring equivalent conditions among all candidates. In the event it is impossible to ensure such conditions and conduct the remote/virtual interview, the Program Coordinators will formally inform the candidate that they should take the exam in person at USP. Hence, the application for a remote/virtual interview does not generate a guaranteed right to this option.

The scores for the Research Project and Interview will be released by the **9<sup>th</sup> November 2018**.

Appeals regarding the Research Project and Interview results must be sent by filling the form ([appealing\\_form](#)) within 48 hours by email to the postgraduate secretariat ([ppg.cp@usp.br](mailto:ppg.cp@usp.br)) and will be answered in the shortest possible time by the coordinators of the program.

## **E – Selection of Admitted candidates**

The selection of admitted candidates will be a result of: a) the criteria of minimum passing grade in phases A and B; b) an average of scores obtained in the evaluation of items B, C and D, weighted in the proportion 2:1:2; c) disqualification of candidates with an average score less than of 7.0 (seven) for the PhD program, **and** d) consideration of the limited number of positions available in the Political Science Doctoral Program.

The preliminary selection results and the ranking of the approved, pending only the decision on possible appeals for the interview, will be released on **November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2018**.

The final selection results and the ranking of the approved will be released on or before the **16<sup>th</sup> November 2018**.

## **3. Graduate Admissions**

The Graduate Program in Political Science will admit up to 15 students for the Master's program and up to 15 students for the PhD program. The number of admissions depends on the approval of candidates in accordance with the established terms described in this call. The appointment of advisers will depend on how many students each adviser is able to take. The granting of scholarships for admitted Master's and PhD candidates will reflect the ranking of candidates in the selection process and the rules established by the program.

The candidates should bear in mind that:

- there are no guarantees they will be offered a scholarship just by being selected;

- there are no guarantees they will be accepted by the supervisor requested. The appointment of advisers will depend on how many students each adviser is able to take (see "Required Documents" above)

The results of each phase, as well as the final result, will be posted both in the Program Administrative Office and on the Department of Political Science website.

When applying for the program, the candidate declares they are aware of the rules of the selection process.

### **A. Positions for Candidates Self-Declared as black or indigenous**

The program offers two positions for entry into the Master's program and two positions for entry into the Doctoral program for candidates that self-declare as **black or indigenous**. The self-declaration is made at the moment of application.

The list of approved applications will disclose the names of those who opted for self-declare themselves as black or indigenous.

Students self-declaring as black or indigenous participate first in the evaluation for common positions. Entering the program in this way the students will not experience any differential treatment according to the self-declaration of origin.

After the common positions have been filled, the quota positions will be filled only by students self-declared as black, brown or indigenous that were not allocated a position from the previous phase. There is no difference between the different types of self-declaration.

To fill the quota positions the same rules of the selection process described in steps A, B, C and D will be applied, with the same criteria for exclusion and ranking. The quota positions of the Master's and Doctoral programs will be filled separately.

The preliminary results of the selection for the quota positions and the order of approval, pending only the decision on possible appeals for the interview, will be released on **9<sup>th</sup> November 2018**.

The final results of the selection and the order of approval will be released by the **16<sup>th</sup> November 2018**.

### **B. Positions for Candidates in the PEG-PG Program (candidates that compete for the PEG-PG program cannot opt for the positions for students self-declared as black, brown or indigenous).**

The entrance of candidates for the program with a CAPES or CNPq grant is only by the route indicated in this call.

The deadline for applications is from the 6<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> August 2018, and it is necessary to send the following information before that date:

- a. A Research Project, formatted to the same standards as section 2.1.D (for Master's candidates) or 2.2.D (for Doctoral candidates).
- b. A curriculum vitae, formatted to the same standards as section 2.1.C (for Master's candidates) or 2.2.C (for Doctoral candidates).

The coordinators of the program will form a committee to evaluate the candidates.

There is no fixed number of positions reserved for these applications. Candidates that compete for the PEG-PG program cannot opt for the positions for students self-declared as black or indigenous.

Based on the evaluation of the CV and research project, the committee will decide on the issuance of a letter of acceptance by the program, a prerequisite for candidates to apply for a CAPES/CNPq scholarship.

### **C. Positions for candidates in the GRE program of the Dean of Graduate Studies of USP**
